


BOOK SHARING AT OUR SEATAC DISTRICT ANNUAL MEETING

Many people who read the Bible stumble when they come across the command to be filled with the Spirit. St. Peter's UWF, Bellevue



St. Peter's UMC in Bellevue has an active group of knitters who gather monthly for updates and fellowship in support of the Operation School Bell Program which supports the Assistance League of Snohomish County with homemade hats and scarves. This group includes women from St. Peter's as well as friends who join in this valuable service project.

St. Peter's UWF sponsored an all-church clothing and food drive for Riverton Park UMC asylum seekers, which started in November 2023 and concluded at the end of January 2024. There was an outpouring of support for the asylum seekers who were camping out at the church at that time. This was during the months of bad weather and up to 400 people at the church. The UWF also collected monetary donations and were able to purchase clothing and a tent. I know many of you in our District as well as others who followed the news have been able to support this project.

Mason UWF. Tacoma

Diana Wilson, President, and Linda Mills, MNO Mission Coordinator, visited the Mason UWF unit in Tacoma in February. We shared the history of the name change and also helped explain the channels of giving for our mission money. We have officers from the Executive Board who can visit your unit if you are interested.

In Memoriam—Phyllis Reynolds

Phyllis enjoyed bowling with her parents, family and friends. Throughout Phyllis' career she worked for the federal government including the United States Postal Service, and later retired as an Accountant in The Department of Interior. In retirement Phyllis took to crafting, and whether it was crocheting, sewing, or ceramics; Phyllis excelled, making beautiful items that many of us enjoy to this day. Also in her retirement she gave of her time and gifts to the church.

Her true gift was service, having served as a President of the United Methodist Women's Council, and as liturgist at Grace United Methodist Church, where she attended in her adulthood. She served for many years as the unit President of United Methodist Women, now known as United Women in Faith. Phyllis also served two terms as Seattle District President, followed by Secretary of the PNW Conference. Phyllis served a term as the Dean of the Christian School of Missions, currently known as Mission U, which is an annual educational event jointly sponsored by United Women in Faith and the United Methodist Church. Phyllis had a beautiful voice and shared that gift by singing in numerous choirs.

At Age 82, Phyllis Ann Reynolds, having suffered a stroke with accompanying health challenges, passed away peacefully on Thursday, March 21, 2024, surrounded by loved ones. She was greeted by the heavenly hosts, her father and mother, Phillip and Alice Young: and her grandson Marshall Curtis Jones, III. Phyllis is survived by her sister Mary Jo, and her daughters Annette, Anita, Angela, and Alicia. Her grandchildren, Phillip (Ciarra), Ariana, Donald Jr., Dante, and Ava.
